## Wolf Pack Veterans lead community clean-up, host barbecue at Mayors Park Saturday, Sept. 26

RENO, Nev. – The University of Nevada, Reno's Wolf Pack Veterans community clean up takes place from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Mayors Park near Stead on Saturday, Sept. 26. A barbecue for volunteers will be held from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The clean-up effort is being led by Ryan Gerchman, a University communications major minoring in addiction services, who also served in the U.S. Marine Corps.

"We are veterans who want to continue being of service to our community," Gerchman said. "Together with Job Corps and University students, I feel we can create a more empathetic community, encourage Job Corps residents to continue to make positive life decisions, clean up our neighborhood and sit down together for a meal."

Gerchman, a member of the Wolf Pack Veterans, said the project is intended to build a bridge between Stead community residents, students residing at the Sierra Nevada Job Corps Campus and area veterans who share in the use of Mayors Park.

"This is becoming even bigger than I had first hoped," Gerchman said. "I always think big, and when I began planning this I knew I would need big help. I'm humbled by the level of support this project has received so far."
