Media-exclusive sneak peek of Peavine Hall Friday, Aug. 7

Media tour of University's newest residential hall, meet with Residential Life and Facilities officials, Peavine Hall student advisors, bonus peek at new PACKTransit bus routes

RENO, Nev. – Peavine Hall, predicted to be the University's first LEED Gold certified building, opens to students for the fall 2015 semester.

With 3,100 students expected to reside in oncampus housing this year, Peavine Hall, located at the corner of Sierra and 11th Streets north of Sierra Hall, will help meet increasing demands for student housing. Accommodating 600 mostly freshman students this year in suite-style rooms of three students each, plans call for the wellness-themed hall to service approximately 400 students as additional residence hall capacity is developed in the coming years.

With an emphasis on healthy living, Peavine Hall features wellness-themed educational opportunities to enable students to prioritize health and wellness activities.

A grand opening and public preview will be held Thursday, Aug. 13 at 10 a.m.

As part of the ever growing campus, two new PACK *Transit* bus routes were implemented this summer to increase safety and efficiency of University shuttle transportation, serving high demand areas and reducing wait times.
